#### **I. CHRONOLOGY OF EVENTS**

##### **06 November 2013**

- The Typhoon East of Mindanao entered the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR). It was named "Yolanda"

##### **07 November 2013**

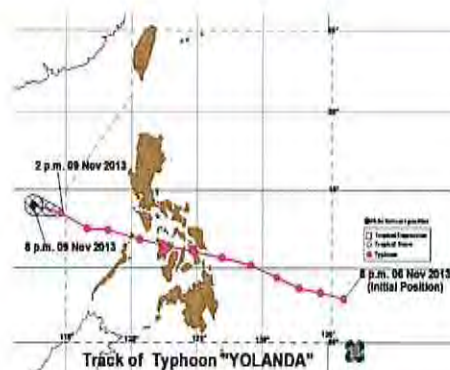
- Typhoon "Yolanda" intensified as it continued to move West Northwest towards Eastern Visayas maintaining its intensity
- In the afternoon, Typhoon "Yolanda" slightly accelerated and maintained its strength and course

##### **08 November 2013**

- At 4:40 AM, Typhoon "Yolanda" made its 1<sup>st</sup> landfall over Guiuan, Eastern Samar
- It further moved as it made its 2<sup>nd</sup> landfall over Tolosa, Leyte at 7:00 AM and its 3<sup>rd</sup> landfall over Daanbantayan, Cebu at about 9:40 AM
- At 10:40 AM, TY "Yolanda" made its 4<sup>th</sup> landfall over Bantayan Island, Cebu and by 12:00NN made its 5<sup>th</sup> landfall over Concepcion, Iloilo
- In the afternoon, it maintained its strength as it approached the Calamian Group of Islands
- At 8:00 PM, it made its 6<sup>th</sup> landfall over Busuanga, Palawan
- Typhoon "Yolanda" slightly weakened as it moved towards the West Philippine Sea

##### **09 November 2013**

- Typhoon "Yolanda" weakened as it continued to traverse over the West Philippines Sea and at 3:30 PM, it was reported to be outside PAR.



#### **II. EFFECTS:**

##### **A. Casualties (Tab A)**

- As of **6:00 PM, 21 November 2013**, **4,011** individuals were reported dead, **18,567** injured and **1,602** are still missing

##### **B. Affected Population (Tab B)**

- A total of **2,157,726 families / 10,023,075 persons** were affected in **10,736 barangays** in **44** provinces, **575 municipalities** and **57 cities** of Regions IV-A, IV-B, V, VI, VII, VIII, X, XI, and CARAGA
- Out of the total affected, **919,830 families / 4,324,963 persons** were displaced and served both inside and outside evacuation centers:

Inside **1,553** evacuation centers: **83,500 families / 389,538 persons**  
Outside evacuation centers: **836,330 families / 3,935,425 persons**

### **C. Damaged Houses (Tab C)**

- The number of damaged houses remained at **1,070,358 houses (529,610 totally / 540,748 partially)**

### **D. Status of Airports and Seaports**

- To date, operations in Tacloban Airport is still limited
- The Philippine Ports Authority has taken over the Port of Tacloban.
- The Matnog, Sorsogon Port to Allen, Northern Samar now has 4 additional barges. The barges were deployed for a total of 16, thereby doubling the normal services.
- The Bulan Port in Sorsogon to Allen, Northern Samar will be allocated for mercy missions

### **E. Cost of Damages (Tab D)**

- The total cost of damages was pegged at **PhP12,656,523,962.50** with **PhP2,143,840,052.74** for infrastructures and **PhP10,512,683,909.76** for agriculture in Regions IV-A, IV-B, V, VI, VII, VIII, and CARAGA
  - In agriculture, a total of **PhP4,906,828,911.70** in value of various crops was affected
  - Damage to livestock amounted to **PhP2,184,011,881.00**, while a total of **PhP2,000,188,917.06** worth of damage to fisheries was reported
  - Damage to irrigation facilities and other agricultural infrastructure amounted to **PhP212,700,000.00** and **PhP1,208,954,200.00**, respectively

### **F. Status of Lifelines**

#### **POWER OUTAGE (Tab E)**

- To date, power outage is still being experienced in some provinces and municipalities in Regions IV-B, V, VI, VII, and VIII
- Based on NGCP's latest inspection, 566 transmission towers and poles are either leaning or toppled and 7 substations are affected which remained unenergized

#### **WATER SUPPLY**

- Municipality of Barbaza, Antique, and some municipalities/cities in Capiz and Iloilo, still do not have water supplies, while water supply in Leyte is sufficient as of 15 November 2013
- Water supply system in Busuanga town proper is functional. Coron, however, is implementing a rationing system.

#### **NETWORK OUTAGE**

- As of **16 November 2013**, Globe, Sun Cellular, Smart, and Talk 'N Text Services have been restored in some provinces of Regions IV-B, VI, VII and VIII
- As of **20 November 2013**, Globe Telecom Cellular Services were restored in Borongan, Eastern Samar, further expanding mobile coverage in Samar and Leyte Islands.
- Globe Mobile Services have also been restored in the towns of Isabel and Palo in Leyte; Lavezares, Rosario, San Jose, and Lope de Vega in Northern Samar; Hinunangan, Limasawa, and Sogod in Southern Leyte; San Sebastian and Pagsanghan in Western Samar; Culasi and Laua-an in Antique, Dumarao in Capiz and Daanbantayan in Cebu

### **G. Declaration of State of Calamity**

- On 11 November 2013, the President issued Presidential Proclamation No. 682 declaring a state of national calamity

### **H. Cost of Assistance (TAB F)**

- A total of **PhP461,665,998.58** worth of relief assistance was provided to the affected families in Regions IV-A, IV-B, V, VI, VII, VIII, X, XI, and CARAGA coming from **DSWD (PhP342,022,437.22)**, **LGUs (PhP43,745,074.27)**, **DOH (PhP28,286,692.55)**, and **NGOs/Other GOs (PhP47,611,794.54)**



## I. Prepositioned and Deployed Assets/Resources (Tab G)

- To date, a total of **33,497 personnel**, **1,320 vehicles**, **107 seacrafts**, **162 aircrafts** and **27,623** other assets/equipment from national, local and foreign agencies, responders and volunteer groups/organizations were prepositioned and deployed to various strategic areas to facilitate/expedite response and medical operations:
  - ✓ Medical operations: **1,604** personnel (foreign and local medical teams)
  - ✓ Response and other operations: **31,884** personnel (foreign and local)
  - ✓ NDRRMC: **9** personnel

## III. EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT (Tab H)

### NDRRMC INITIATIVES

- Upgraded NDRRMOC into an Emergency Operation Center (EOC) under **RED ALERT STATUS**
- Disseminated Weather Bulletins and 24-Hour Public Weather Forecasts to all RDRRMCs/OCDCs through SMS, facsimile and websites for further dissemination to their respective Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal level
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their respective areas of responsibilities (AOR)
- Alerted NDRRMC member agencies for close coordination with their respective local agencies in the affected Regions on the preparedness /precautionary measures undertaken prior to the land fall of the typhoon and for monitoring of the situation and effects through their respective local agencies in the affected regions to report to NDRRMOC
- The OCD Administrator and Chief, NDRRMOC attended press conferences at PAGASA and regularly conducts personal interviews and press conferences about updates of the effects of Typhoon "YOLANDA" and assessment of needs of the affected population
- Facilitated TMG Meetings with Executive Secretary Ochoa and Emergency Meeting with H.E. Pres. Benigno Simeon Aquino III held at the NDRRRMC Conference Room, Camp Gen. Emilio Aguinaldo
- NDRRMOC is still continuously monitoring the situation and response efforts of various responders in the affected areas particularly in Region VIII
- In anticipation of the influx of donations from international community (countries and organizations) after the declaration of national state of calamity, NDRRMC activated "One-Stop Shop" on 12 November 2013, to facilitate the acceptance of the said donations
- OCD-NDRRMC provided PhP118 million worth of financial assistance to AFP to augment operational expenses (petroleum, oil and lubricant requirements)
- On 18 November 2013, "Task Force Normalization" was organized to spur economic activity in Leyte
- Mr. Stanley Tabiando of DTI reported that the DISKWENTO CARAVAN will be opening on 21 November 2013
- Activated the following task forces with their respective leads:
  - ✓ Food and water distribution - Sec. Corazon Soliman, DSWD
  - ✓ Cadaver Collection - F/Supt. Cordeta, BFP
  - ✓ Debris Clearing and Cleaning- Sec. Francisco Tolentino, MMDA
  - ✓ Law and Order - Gen. Monteagudo, PNP
  - ✓ Health - Dr. Bueno, DOH
  - ✓ Yolanda - MGen. Velarmino, AFP

- ✓ Reconstruction - To be determined
- ✓ Normalization - Leyte Vice Gov. Loreto  
City Administrator Tecson Lim, Tacloban

- All 24 municipalities covered by Tacloban hub were provided with relief. 2,847 sacks of rice, water, and canned goods, plus 6,860 actual food packs were provided

#### **SUMMARY OF RDRRMCS/PDRRMCS INITIATIVES**

- RDRRMCS **I, III, IV-A, IV-B, V, VI, VIII, X, XI, XII, and NCR** raised their respective RDRRM Operations Centers to Red Alert status; regularly disseminated weather/flood bulletins/advisories and gale warning to all concerned local DRRMCs, RDRRM member-agencies, tri-media and fisher folks association thru facsimile and SMS; alerted their respective RDRRM member agencies and local DRRMCs affected to closely monitor the situation and effects of Typhoon “YOLANDA” in their respective AORs, to undertake pre-emptive measures; and uploaded advisories to OCD-RDRRM Facebook page to effectively ensure public safety and achieve zero casualties
- PDRRMCS disseminated weather advisories to all M/BDRRM members; maintained 24 hour monitoring of the weather situation of respective areas; closely coordinated with response agencies for assistance in terms of search and rescue and relief operations; advised all LGUs to put their OpCen on alert status and prepositioned all their available SAR equipment and rescue groups on standby for immediate response and deployment; prepositioned food and non-food items for assistance to affected families; convened a meeting to discuss preparedness and response activities and responsibilities of each council member; deployed provincial rescue teams to flood - prone areas; advised all low-lying barangays for necessary evacuation; and advised fishermen to refrain from fishing

- Activated three community precincts
- Approximately 99% of PRO VIII personnel are accounted for and an additional 1,283 PNP personnel from other regions will augment the organic PRO VIII personnel



### **Combined Joint Task Force Yolanda**

- Continues collection of cadaver in Tacloban City and Tanauan
- Continues road clearing operations in Tacloban City
- Task Force Yolanda will activate a conveyor belt system for relief sourced from the Ormoc and Guiuan hubs; this is to ensure that all serviced communities are provided with needed relief goods
- Sent senior official to Ormoc and Guiuan hubs to replicate conveyor system of relief distribution
- Deployed 260 personnel with 18 N35 trucks from Mindanao; 42 vehicles to Guiuan (15 vehicles), Ormoc (10 vehicles) and Tacloban (17 vehicles); 6 dumptrucks for transporting of relief goods downloaded at the airport; 10 vehicles for transporting relief goods downloaded at the sea port; and Naval Task Group with 4 N35 trucks, 1 dump truck, 1 back hoe and 1 payloader
- On 19 November 2013, a council meeting was conducted with Sec. Mar Roxas presiding. The following were discussed:
  - ✓ BFP is requesting for 1 backhoe since there are some high areas where dead bodies can no longer reached
  - ✓ Sec Roxas instructed FSSUPT Cordeta to coordinate with Arlington Funeral Services, who shall be assisting in the recovery and retrieval of dead bodies
  - ✓ Sec Roxas instructed the contingents from the US Marines to coordinate with MMDA and DPWH
  - ✓ Gen Velarmino reported that they have now 2093 total manpower. LTO's 9 buses have arrived and unloaded relief goods. The said buses are now ready to take passengers from the airport going outside of Tacloban City
  - ✓ Sec Roxas assigned Mr. Francis Martinez of the MMDA as the ground commander in the Astrodome and to head in the clearing operations
  - ✓ DSWD will already be turning over the relief distribution to the City Government of Tacloban. DSWD will still be providing allocation to the City Government every 2 days, including the relief goods from other donors
  - ✓ DSWD is currently coordinating with other international partners for the provision of tents, tarps and other non-food items
  - ✓ Sec Roxas instructed Dr Raquel Fortun of UP to work with the City Health Office for additional medical support/interventions particularly on the collection of dead bodies
- The UP Forensic experts coordinated with local officials in accordance to proper procedures in recovery of dead bodies
- TF Yolanda is now a Combined Joint Task Force (CJTF), hence, now called CJTF YOLANDA
- The total manpower for the CJTF is 5,079 inclusive of personnel from other agencies, volunteers, and rescue groups
- The US Marines Expeditionary Force is recommended to be deployed in Basey and Marabut in Samar and Guiuan in Eastern Samar
- The Bayanihan Team arrived with twenty-four (24) M35s and two (2) vans
- Land Bank – Tacloban reported that three (3) ATMs opened on 19 November 2013 and is currently on full teller operation
- The Philippine Coast Guard is instructed to work closely with CJTF YOLANDA for the logistics and DSWD for efficient transporting of goods to the identified relief hubs
- MMDA reported the repair of three (3) dump trucks and turned it over to CJTF YOLANDA

- Coordinated AFP Command Center and PRC for the conduct of rescue operations to the affected and trapped residents in the region

- On 08 November 2013, PDRRMC Dinagat Islands conducted Disaster Assessment Needs Analysis by each LGU counterpart and concerned agencies/Provincial Office; conducted Rapid Damage Assessment and Needs Analysis (RDANA) in the 7 municipalities of the province; distributed relief goods to all municipalities and clearing operations of tree branches were conducted
- PDRMC Agusan del Norte deployed Agusan del Norte Emergency Response Team (ADNERT) to Western, Central and Eastern part of the province for immediate response
- PDRRMC Surigao del Norte activated relief centers for preparation and distribution of food packs; held emergency meeting for discussion on actions to be taken and damage assessment together with PDRRMC Dinagat Islands
- CDRRMO Butuan deployed medical and search and rescue team to Tacloban City; prepared food packs containing 3kgs of rice, 3pcs of noodles and 3 pcs of canned goods
