

Ebola virus disease – All BMJ resources are freely available



The 2014 Ebola outbreak in west Africa was the largest and most complicated that the world has ever seen. After it was first identified in the forested regions of south eastern Guinea in March 2014, it spread to Liberia, Sierra Leone, and Nigeria and was declared a "public health emergency of international concern" by the World Health Organization. It's been reported that over 11 000 people died from the disease during the epidemic

On 8 May 2018, the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DCR) declared a new outbreak of Ebola—its last was in 2017. So far 19 people have died, including one healthcare worker.
