NATIONAL RESPONSE TO SUICIDE PREVENTION

The Ministry of Health and Social Services (MOHSS) is mandated with the prevention, intervention and postvention of suicide in Namibia.

LEARN THE WARNING SIGNS:

If someone shows one or more of the following symptoms, it may be a signal of a suicidal crisis:

- Feelings of hopelessness
- Anxiety, agitation, trouble sleeping or sleeping all the time
- Expressions of having no reason for living; no sense of purpose in life
- Feelings of being trapped like there is no way out
- Increased alcohol and/or drug use
- Withdrawal from friends, family and/or community
- Rage, uncontrolled anger and seeking revenge
- Reckless behaviour or more risky activities, seemingly without thinking
- Dramatic mood changes

Stressors, loss, or a setback can trigger a suicide attempt for someone who is at risk.

WHAT CAN YOU DO:

- If someone you know, shows or expresses suicidal thoughts or plans, get help immediately by contacting the help lines below.

Express concern, actively listen to him or her, ask him or her about suicidal thoughts and plans, and assist that person to get help.
