

In Numbers

- 2.1 million affected people, of which 894,000 are children.
- 1.4 million people require humanitarian assistance.
- 806,000 people severely food insecure.

Beneficiaries 630,000 reached 800,000 targeted




Situation Update

- On 4 October, Haiti was hit by a category 4
 Hurricane. Initial reports revealed that over
 175,000 people were displaced and nearly 550 had
 died.
- The movement of commodities for humanitarian assistance has slowed down as a consequence of limited availability of security assets due to the elections held on 20 November. Preliminary results should be published early next week and the security constraints remain.
- Heavy rains affecting the area around Jérémie make it extremely challenging for the trucks to reach the distribution sites.
- The preliminary results of the market analysis carried out by WFP, show a general increase of prices and unavailability of local products along with a strong continued dependence on food assistance.



WFP Response

- Between 7 October and 25 November, WFP reached 630,000 people and distributed a total of 6,600mt of food. Supplementary feeding has been distributed to 3,130 children aged between 6 and 59 months (BSF).
- Registration of beneficiaries for cash transfers
 has started in 2 of the 7 targeted communes.
 Distributions are supposed to start on the second
 week of December. The Ministère des Affaires
 Sociales et du Travail (MAST) has sent a team to
 Jérémie to support local MAST in rolling out CBT.
- FAO is starting to distribute seeds to 4,500 households in Grande Hanse. WFP has already reached those zones with seeds protection rations in order to prevent seeds consumption.







Logistics Working Group

- On 23 and 24 November the Logistics Working Group in Jérémie facilitated the loading and delivery of trucks (9.44mt/ 59m³) with shelter items, family kits & tarpaulins, on behalf of IFRC for distribution at Previle and Corail.
- •On 24 November the Logistics Working Group facilitated and completed the loading of food and non-food items on behalf of WFP (420mt) and ACTED (4,5mt) to proceed with the **first rotation of the barge** foreseen for Anse d'Harinault on Friday 25 November.
- •The Logistics Working Group continues to monitor the **conditions of secondary roads** to update the map of access constraints and to improve coordination and planning. Access to **mountainous communities** remains challenging because of the network of inadequate, damaged or non-existent roads.







ICT Working Group

• An ETC assessment on community information and communication needs and gaps has commenced in Haiti, with the first set of community interviews having taken place in Jérémie. These will be followed up in two more sites in Jérémie before commencing next week in Les Cayes.



Sesourcing

- So far, the shortfall for the Protracted Relief and Recovery Operation amounts to 48%. USD 25 million are still urgently required to meet the food needs of the targeted 800,000 beneficiaries.
- The SO, launched for logistics and telecommunication augmentation and coordination, is currently 50% funded and WFP needs USD 5 million to continue efforts providing vital logistics and telecommunications support.
