### In Numbers

- **2.1 million** affected people, of which **894,000** are children.
- **1.4 million** people require humanitarian assistance.
- **806,000** people severely food insecure.

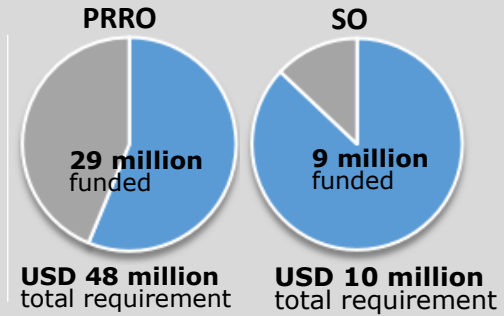


### Assisted people

### Situation Update

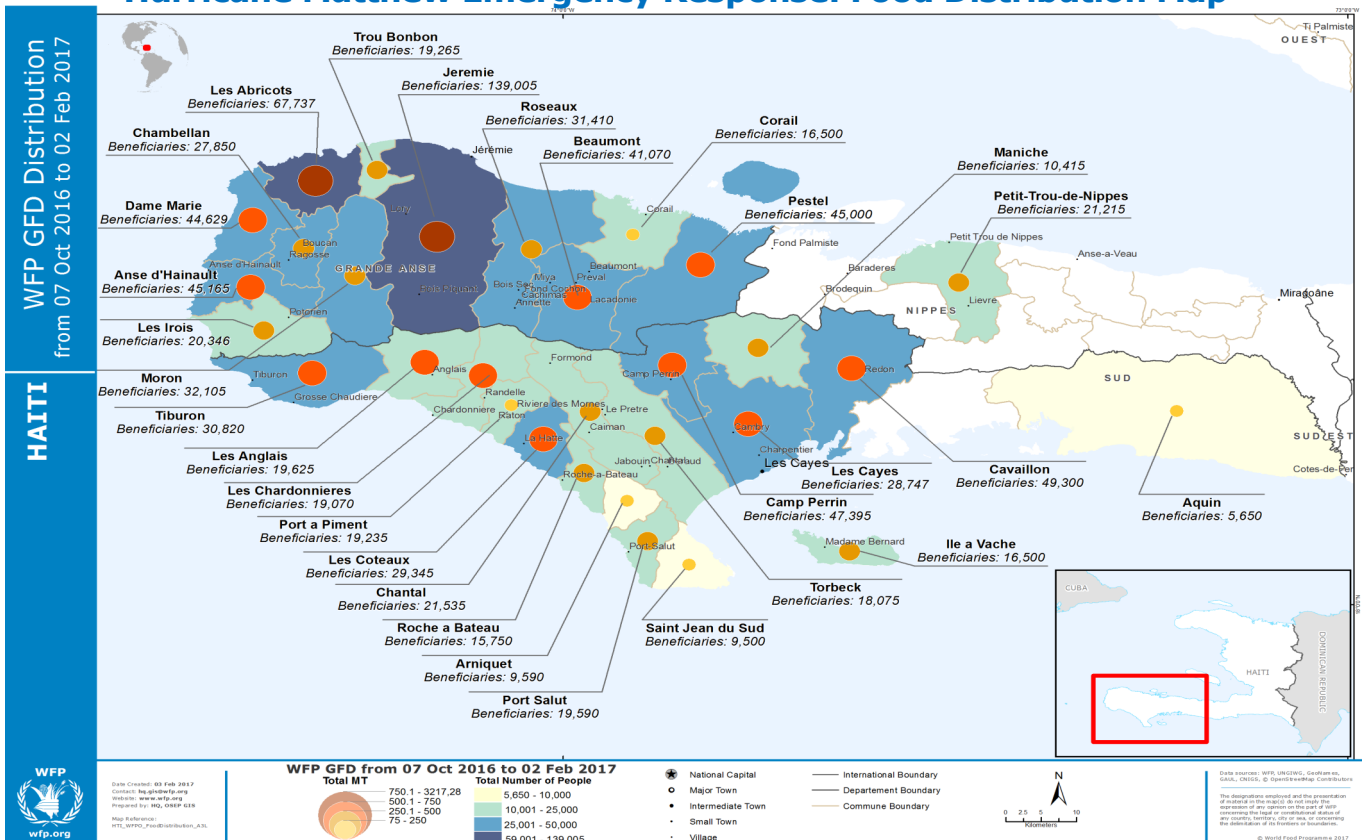
- The **overall security situation** is relatively **calm** and WFP operations continue without incident at the moment.
- **Escort service** provided by MINUSTAH and HNP **has resumed in Jeremie and les Cayes** after being on hold from 25-31 January during the election period.
- **General food distributions** has also **resumed** from the 1 February in Grande-Anse and South departments.



### WFP Response

- Since the beginning of the operation, WFP has **reached 921,439 people** with general food distributions with a total of **15,997 mt of food**.
- In total since the beginning of the operation, WFP provided **specialized nutritious food** to a total of **26,175 children under the age of five** and **8,620 pregnant and nursing women**.

## Cash-based Transfers

- **More than 3,200 people** have this last week each **received a 4,060 HTG** (approximately US\$60) cash-based transfer in Camp Perrin (Department of Sud). In addition, **beneficiary registration was validated** and **SIM cards were distributed** in Sud department (Camp Perrin) as well as in the Grande-Anse department (Anse d'Hailnault, Bonbon, Beaumont, Coral and Pestel).
- **In collaboration with CARE, WFP organized field missions for the members of the "Ministère des Affaires Sociales et du Travail" (MAST)** to visit both organisations' operations in the departments of Sud and Grande-Anse to follow-up on operations and strengthen coordination on the ground between partners and local populations. A **tripartite debriefing** of the MAST mission is planned next week to **identify actions** to be taken to improve **coordination** between **local** authorities, partners and all stakeholders.

## Logistics Working Group

- **Air support** facilitated by the Logistics Working Group has allowed cargo transport to **remote and inaccessible locations in Sud and Grand Anse departments** (in total 420 mt transported to 47 different locations on behalf of fifty-five organizations). Every day, **an average of 30 passengers (over 2,800 in total) are transported by UNHAS flights between PaP, Les Cayes and Jeremie** to support distributions, conduct assessments and other humanitarian activities.
- **Since October 2016** the Logistics Working Group has facilitated storage to the partners for a total of **3,776.10 MT/ 11,593.19 cbm** humanitarian cargo, and road transport for a total of **2,836.25MT/ 7,376.28 cbm**.
- The Logistics Working Group is **facilitating air transport** on behalf of the partner "Médecin Sans Frontière" Belgium, which requested assistance with the transport of 344mt of NFIs and construction material to villages inaccessible by road in Sud and Grand-Anse Departments.

## ICT Working Group

- The Telecommunications working group **has now completed the recovery** of its **satellite dish connections** from Les Cayes and Jeremie, along with the majority of the Ericsson supplied equipment. **A guest wifi remains at the COUDs and logistics base in each location.**
- **In total 12 sites in Jeremie and 4 in Les Cayes have a free wifi connection** being used by **971 humanitarians** from 205 organizations, including the Department of Civil Protection (DPC), UN agencies and NGOs.
- The rehabilitation of Community radio stations in Grande-Anse and Sud, with the Working Group planning to refurbish 4 community radio stations should be operational by **mid-March**. Equipment has started arriving in Haiti, with the **deployments** planned to **start first week of February**.

## Timeline: Hurricane Matthew Response

- 04 Oct** | Hurricane Matthew makes landfall.
- 08 Oct** | First WFP food distribution.
- 10 Oct** | Results of EFSA show Grande Anse and Sud are most affected areas and 806,000 are in urgent need of food
- 04 Dec** | WFP jointly with FAO starts providing seed protection food ration.
- 30 Dec** | WFP provides first cash transfers to 16,960 beneficiaries.
- 05 Jan** | The volatile security situation leads to the temporary suspension of WFP operations.
- 19 Jan** | WFP operations have resumed fully in Sud and partially in Grande-Anse following a security assessment.
- 29 Jan** | Results of EFSA conducted in December show food insecurity halved in areas affected by Hurricane Matthew and where WFP intervened.
- 31 Jan** | Partnership between MSF Belgium and WFP to support the transport of 344mt of NFIs and construction material to inaccessible villages.
