2017 Revised Regional Refugee Response Plan: Overview

OVERVIEW: APRIL REVISION

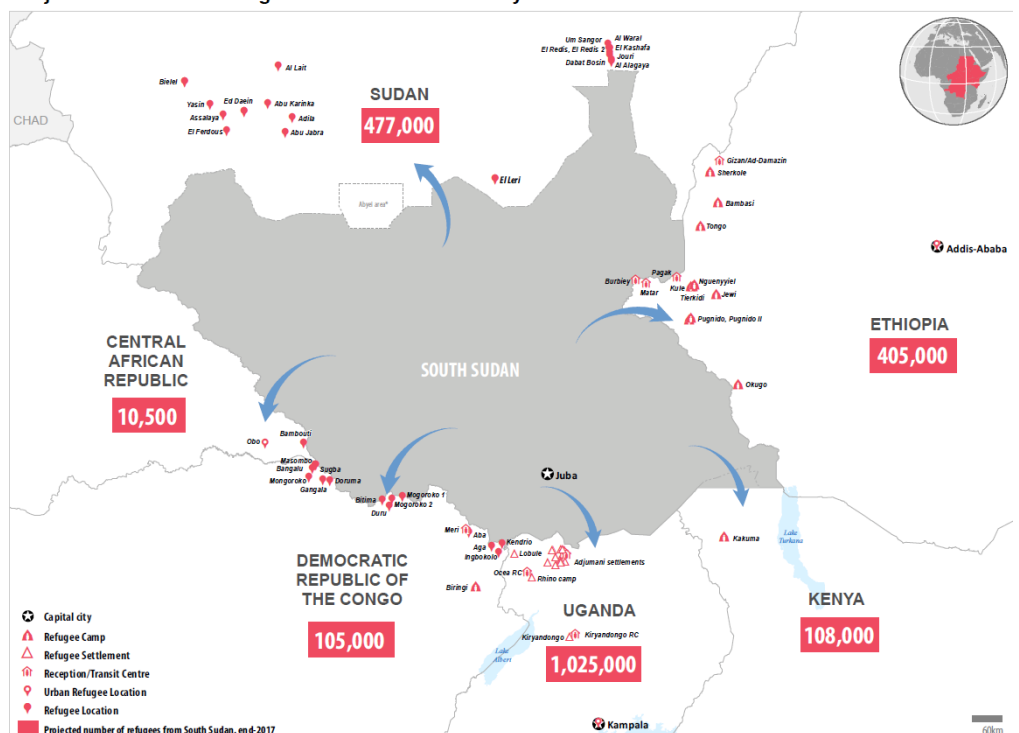
The South Sudan Regional Refugee Response Plan (RRRP) 2017 articulates the regional protection and humanitarian needs of an anticipated 2.13 million South Sudanese refugees by 31 December 2017. The RRRP outlines the inter-agency response strategy and financial requirements of 58 agencies responding across six countries of asylum: Central African Republic, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Ethiopia, Kenya, Sudan and Uganda.

The April revision of the RRRP was prompted by larger than anticipated refugee movements into Sudan and Uganda in 2017. The end of year planning figure for Sudan was surpassed in March and if current trends continue, Uganda will exceed its planning figure during the second quarter of 2017. The revised RRRP contains updated response plans for Sudan and Uganda to address the increased needs in these two host countries.

Projected number of refugees from South Sudan by 31 December 2017

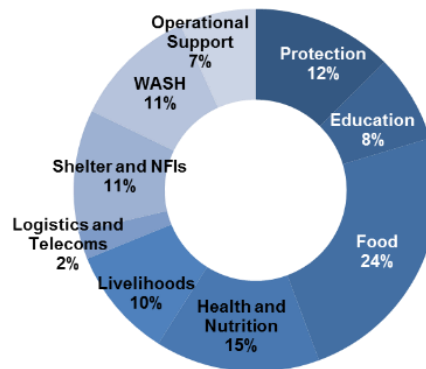

REGIONAL STRATEGIC OBJECTIVES

1. Uphold the quality of asylum for South Sudanese refugees in the region by meeting their lifesaving needs according to applicable minimum standards.
2. Anchor the response within national and regional multi-year protection frameworks, policies, laws, and standards which address legal and physical protection needs of South Sudanese refugees.
3. Enhance biometric registration, documentation and data management in collaboration with host Governments to support implementation of durable solutions strategies.
4. Proactively explore and, where applicable, pursue innovative approaches stemming from participatory assessments with refugees, Governments, humanitarian and development actors, private sector, and civil society, to alleviate the increasing dependency of refugees on aid.

COORDINATION

The number of partners involved in the South Sudan refugee response across the six countries of asylum has grown from 39 in 2015 to 58 in 2017. The Refugee Coordination Model (RCM) is the framework to coordinate the humanitarian response in the context of a large refugee influx. UNHCR coordinates the overall response in collaboration with Governments, UN agencies, local and international NGOs, as well as with refugee and local host communities.
