

1. Preparation of latrine construction

Minimum requirements	Required actions
Ensure women's and girls' opinions are reflected in location and design of latrines to ensure privacy and safety	Women and girls are consulted on location of latrines and especially safe locations and the safety of the routes to/from latrine
	Women and girls are consulted how they manage their menstruation and how they dispose materials.
	Women and girls are consulted on how to ensure privacy and safety of latrine in the context
	Women's and girls' opinions are reflected to the location and design of latrine

*** Through coordination one can link up with CCCM/ protection cluster on lighting issues within the camps to avert risk of GBV occurrences in IDP settlements.

2. Structure

Minimum requirements	Options for required actions***
Enclosed latrines	
Provide privacy in latrines	Barrier screen with offset entrance
	Consult women and girls if there are additional ways enhance their privacy and safety at the structure.
Ensure structures for males and females are separate and clearly marked.	Separate latrines for men & women. Signs with pictures and writing in the appropriate language to indicate the male / female structures are posted immediately upon opening the structure.
Emergency trench latrines with simple structure	
Ensure sex-segregated facilities are provided which are clearly marked.	Separate blocks for men and women clearly marked
	Entrances on opposite sides
	If male and female stalls cannot be in separate blocks make use a hard surface (metal or wood) as a barrier wall between male and female stalls
Ensure privacy in the latrine.	Barrier screen with offset
	Weight on bottom of flap stop wind from blowing the door open
	Consult women and girls if there are additional ways enhance their privacy and safety at the structure.
Ensure the latrine can be fastened from inside	One side of flap door nailed to post
	Nail with string attached to the flap door to latch flap from the inside
Shared block latrines with solid superstructure	
Ensure latrine is lockable from inside	Solid doors with solid slide locks on the inside
Ensure privacy in the latrine	Barrier screen with offset
	Other way to prevent anyone from seeing the latrine (consult girls and women how best you can ensure their privacy)
Ensure sex-segregated facilities are provided which are clearly marked	Separate blocks for men & women clearly marked
	Entrances on opposite sides
	Metal separation wall between male and female stalls

*** These are some of options to implement the minimum requirements. But the solutions to satisfy minimum requirement will be different according to the local context. You can identify suitable solutions in consultation with girls and women.

3. Management

Minimum requirements	Required actions
Ensure latrines are managed safely for women and girls	Ensure at least 50% of latrine attendants/volunteers are female
	Ensure ALL latrine attendants/volunteers are trained on Code of Conduct and sign the code of conduct.
Ensure sex-segregation	If signage is disappeared or erased by any reasons, take immediate action to put signage at the latrine.
	Community outreach to explain communities which latrines are for women and for men.
	Identify the best way to keep sex-segregation (discourage men to use women's latrine) with community members.
