# **ANC & PNC Key Findings**

- **79%** of facilities provide **ANC**, **71%** provide **PNC**, and **76%** provide **TT vaccine**.
- Most facilities do not have all the items necessary to provide quality counselling, especially ANC guidelines.
- More than three-quarters of all facilities offering ANC have all basic ANC equipment and medicines and 61% have all infection control items.
- Capacity to conduct anaemia, urine protein, urine glucose, syphilis tests is high, but only 56% of facilities offering ANC can conduct blood grouping and Rh factor tests.

# **ANC & PNC Key Findings**

- 91% of facilities that offer ANC routinely treat STIs and
  87% have medicines to treat all 4 most common STIs.
- Three-quarters of providers gather a full patient history.
- Only 51% of first-visit ANC clients were given or prescribed a TT vaccine.
- Only 5% of ANC clients were counselled about warning signs of pregnancy complications.
- 12% of facilities charge user fees for ANC.

# **Delivery Care Key Findings**

- Two-thirds of facilities provide normal delivery services;
  9% provide C-sections, and 83% have emergency transport for maternal emergencies.
- Only **28%** of facilities provide any home delivery services.
- 65% of delivery facilities have all infection control items.
- 40% of facilities have all basic supplies for delivery (suction apparatus least common).
- Very few facilities have emergency equipment to assist labor or perform a C-section.

# **Newborn Care Key Findings**

- **91%** or more of facilities providing delivery services routinely provide **OPV** and **BCG** to newborns.
- 6% of facilities provide newborns with prelacteal feeding.
- Only 19% of providers received delivery-related training in the 12 months before the survey, and only 18% received training in lifesaving skills.
- 62% of facilities providing delivery services can provide emergency support to newborns.
