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INFORMATION ON SPECIAL NEEDS NETWORK

Aims:

- To reach out and form a network between parents and professionals in the field of disability.
- To function as a support organisation.
- To facilitate intervention programmes and assistance in mainstream and other educational settings as required, tailored to the person's needs.
- To assist in setting up relevant programmes for young children, adolescents and adults.
- To facilitate the training of parents and professionals in disability issues, alternative communication methods, behaviour issues.
- To function as a resource for specific assistance in various disabilities, sibling support, etc., eg: Autism Progamme; Facilitated Communication Methods; Down's Syndrome.
- To set up outreach projects in various communities and towns as requested.
- To set up and facilitate relevant intervention-, educational-, life skills- or other centres.
- To raise awareness and lobby for the rights of children, adolescents and adults with a disability, so as to ensure an optimum quality of life for the individual.
- To build up and maintain a resource database of available organisations, schools and centres in Namibia and elsewhere.

The above will be achieved through the following broadly defined activities:

- 1 Purchase of a property to function as Multi-purpose Resource and Training Centre;
- 2 Service & Project Development, Co-ordination and Fundraising for Projects;
- 3 Early Intervention, School- and Transition Adolescent Services;
- 4 Adult Services, including Sheltered Workshop & Job Coaching;
- 5 Structured programmes and training iro Autism Spectrum Disorders & PDD-NOS;
- 6 Alternative & Augmentative Communication training, methods and equipment;
- 7 Library & Resources, Newsletter & Networking, incl. collaboration with tertiary institutions and Government;
- 8 Training for Families, School Assistants, Teachers & Professionals;
- 9 Research regarding Disability Issues in the Namibian Context.
