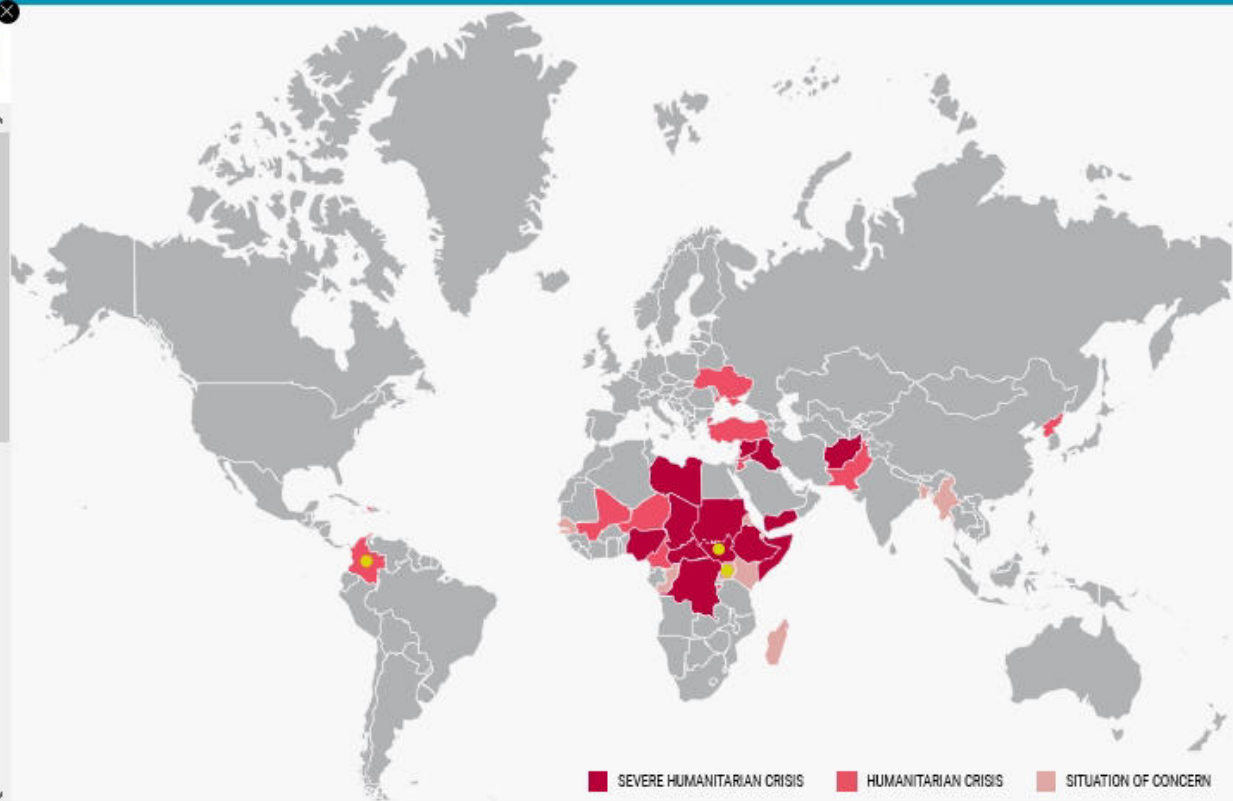
SOUTH SUDAN

Food security is projected to deteriorate in 2018. The number of counties in IPC Phase 4 is likely to increase to 17 between February and April and to 31 from May to July. If humanitarian assistance is absent, 7 million people are likely to be in IPC Phase 3 or above between May and July, including 150,000 in IPC Phase 5. Food insecurity is mainly driven by conflict, related displacement, and macroeconomic deterioration. Violence will likely continue as the December ceasefire between opposition and government has been repeatedly broken and inter-communal clashes persist.
