

PRACTICAL WAYS OF BUILDING INCLUSIVE PROJECT CYCLE MANAGEMENT

Review and evaluation

Evaluation step	Approaches to consider to maximise inclusion
Evaluate the success of the completed or ongoing activity in terms of its original objectives.	<p>Capture the perspective of all stakeholders through the selected qualitative and quantitative methods, ensuring inclusion of methods which are accessible and which identify different perspectives.</p> <p>Ask people about their views about the project overall.</p>
Finding out about effects of the project on persons with disabilities.	Collect information directly from people with disabilities or their representative organisations in your target area.
<p>Finding out what changes have occurred since the project started and whether there is a link between what the project did and these changes.</p> <p>Finding out about the impact of the project.</p>	Ensure the disability objective(s) has been evaluated for outcome.
Maintain relationship building and community interaction.	Regularly consult with stakeholders to get advice on about how they see the project unfolding.
Document lessons to guide future programs.	Broadly communicate evaluation outcomes and learning to people with disabilities and groups working with people with disabilities and document responses.
Finalise the project, or if ongoing, build in strategies to sustain the benefits.	Communicate outcomes and future plans using approaches suitable to participants with disabilities.
