| Evaluation step   | Approaches to consider to maximise inclusion   |

| Evaluate the success of the completed or<br>ongoing activity in terms of its original<br>objectives.  | Capture the perspective of all stakeholders<br>through the selected qualitative and<br>quantitative methods, ensuring inclusion of<br>methods which are accessible and which<br>identify different perspectives.<br>Ask people about their views about the project<br>overall. |
| Finding out about effects of the project on persons with disabilities.  | Collect information directly from people with disabilities or their representative organisations in your target area.  |
| Finding out what changes have occurred since<br>the project started and whether there is a link<br>between what the project did and these<br>changes.<br>Finding out about the impact of the project. | Ensure the disability objective(s) has been evaluated for outcome.   |
| Maintain relationship building and community interaction.   | Regularly consult with stakeholders to get advice on about how they see the project unfolding.   |
| Document lessons to guide future programs.  | Broadly communicate evaluation outcomes and<br>learning to people with disabilities and groups<br>working with people with disabilities and<br>document responses.   |
| Finalise the project, or if ongoing, build in strategies to sustain the benefits.   | Communicate outcomes and future plans<br>using approaches suitable to participants<br>with disabilities.   |
