Note: The CYP is calculated by multiplying the quantity of each method distributed to clients by a conversion factor, which yields an estimate of the duration of contraceptive protection provided per unit of that method.</i></p>

<p><i>Definition: An index measuring the extent to which women were made aware of alternative methods of contraception and were provided adequate information about them. The index score is equal to the number of women who respond "yes" to the following three questions: (1) Were you informed about other methods? (2) Were you informed about side effects? (3) Were you told what to do if you experienced side effects?</i></p>				
● 15	<b>Percentage of women who were provided with information on family planning during their last visit with a health service provider</b>	21.1%	AW	2013/14 DHS
<p><i>Definition: The percentage of women who were provided information on family planning in some form at the time of their last contact with a health service provider. The contact could occur in either a clinic or community setting. Information could have been provided via a number of mechanisms, including counseling, information, education and communication materials or talks/conversations about family planning.</i></p>				
● 16	<b>Percentage of women who make family planning decisions alone or jointly with their husbands or partners</b>	84.0%	MW	2013/14 DHS
<p><i>Definition: The percentage of women who make decisions on matters, such as whether and when to initiate and terminate contraceptive use and choice of contraceptive method, either by themselves or based upon consensus joint decision-making with their husband/partner.</i></p>

<p><i>Definition: The number of births to adolescent females, aged 15-19 occurring during a given reference period per 1,000 adolescent females.</i></p>
