An interesting approach is the one implemented in Hong Kong: "The Hong Kong branch of RCSC (HKRC), resumed its psychological support (PSS) programme "Shall we talk", which is a long-time programme of HKRC. This initiative allows the public to book a PSS session by mobile messaging application messages. Information and PSS messages tailored for 2019-nCoV have also been shared through social media. HKRC has also provided relief



materials to the government's quarantine camps according to their service agreement with Social Welfare Department."

c. Psychological First Aid

- i. In 2014, WHO, UNICEF and others adapted the Psychological First Aid Manual into the <u>Psychological first aid during Ebola virus disease outbreaks</u>, transforming it into a "guide for field workers [...] to better respond to the challenges of Ebola virus disease outbreaks. Ebola poses specific problems for affected people (e.g., stigmatization, isolation, fear, and possible abandonment), their caregivers and responders (e.g., safety, access to updated information). <u>Here</u> also you can find the Facilitator Manual.

- In 2014, UNICEF worked with partners and government in Africa and developed a <u>Guidance Note: Operating Safe and Protective Learning</u> <u>Environment in EVD outbreak contexts</u>. Linked to this is a <u>Proposed Provision</u> <u>of Open/Distance Learning for children document</u>.
- ii. Similarly, in 2014, IRC adapted its education program to Small Learning Groups Approach following closure of all schools in 2014 to minimize further spread of the virus in the country. Available is the <u>Guidance Note</u> for this intervention.
