Latest National COVID-19 Response News

- As of 20 January, 944 patients are being treated in medical institutions, of whom 156 are in serious condition and 30 are in critical condition (MoH on <u>coronavirus.uz</u> and via Public Relations Dept).
- State Statistics Committee publishes statistics of yearly deaths. In 2020, the amount of deaths in Uzbekistan was 13.5% higher than the previous year, with over 20,200 additional deaths. Particularly, the number of deaths due to respiratory diseases and infectious diseases has increased (gazeta.uz).

HEALTH RESPONSE

Health Capacity-Building

- On 19 January, WHO Regional Office conducted a global webinar on COVID-19 vaccination. The UK, Israel and Croatia presented findings on their national vaccination campaigns.
- On 21 January, a webinar as part of the global series on Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) took place, organized by the University of New Mexico, the CDC and WHO. The webinar focused on 'Delivery Strategies and IPC Procedures for COVID-19 Vaccination'.
- WHO Regional Office and the European Centre for Disease Prevention and Control (ECDC) organized an online conference of the 'Laboratory Network'. The conference gave an overview of SARS-CoV-2 variants, presented an update on ECDC rapid risk assessment and sequencing guidance, and discussed variant viruses in circulation in the UK.
- On 25 January, WHO Regional Office and ECDC will conduct a regional webinar on 'Monitoring uptake and effectiveness of COVID-19 vaccine in the WHO European Region'. The webinar will provide an overview of regional efforts to coordinate reporting of data on COVID-19 vaccine uptake and effectiveness, provide guidelines on standardized vaccine effectiveness studies, and share early experiences from countries on monitoring the COVID-19 vaccine uptake and effectiveness.

Vaccination

 Last week, the National Technical Working Group (NATAG) for COVID-19 vaccine introduction met to discuss WHO tools to estimate target populations. Furthermore, the meeting addressed the country readiness assessment using VIFAT (vaccine introduction readiness assessment tool).

ADDITIONAL RESPONSE PRIORITIES

Protection and Key Populations

 Within the joint programme on social protection, UNDP organized a weekly awareness-raising radio programme to promote the rights of people with disabilities during the pandemic.





Socio-Economic Mitigation

- In view of the growing importance of digitalization, including due to the pandemic, UNDP and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs have launched a new project to develop digital economic diplomacy. The project will aim to:
 - Develop the concept of Economic Diplomacy;
 - Introduce innovative approaches and modern information and communication technologies at the Ministry;
 - Increase the **potential and qualifications of Ministry staff**.
