47.8% of the world population has received at least one dose of a COVID-19 vaccine.

6.7 billion doses have been administered globally, and **20.54 million** are now administered each day.

Only **2.8%** of people in low-income countries have received at least one dose.

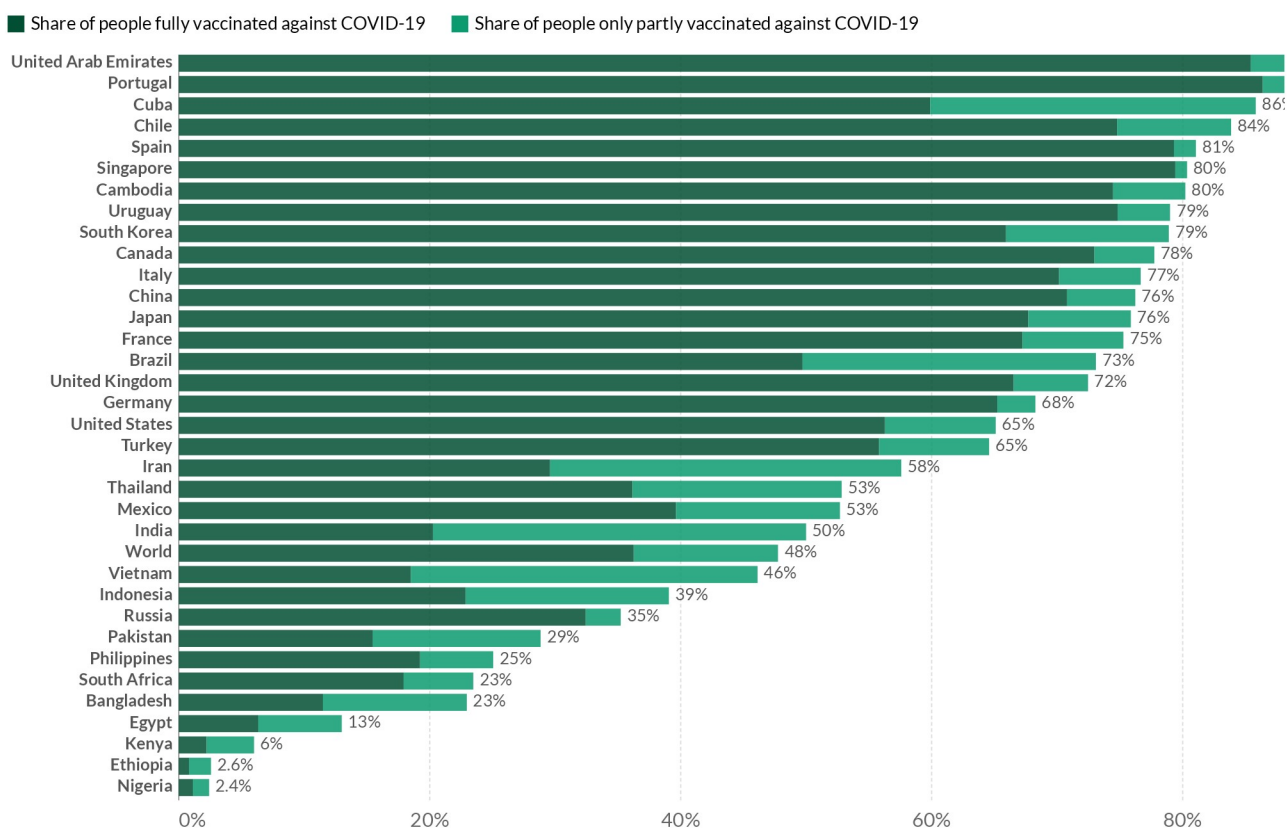
