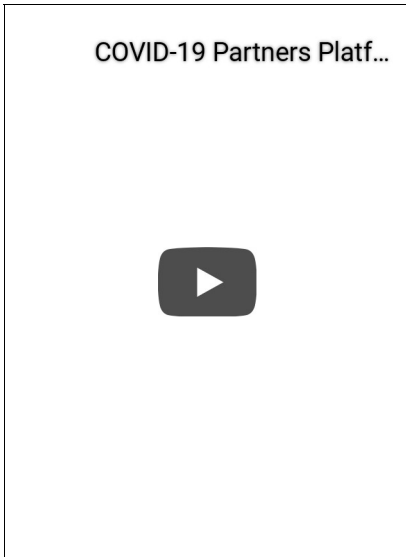

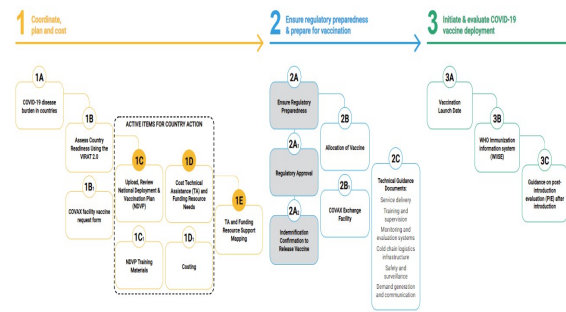

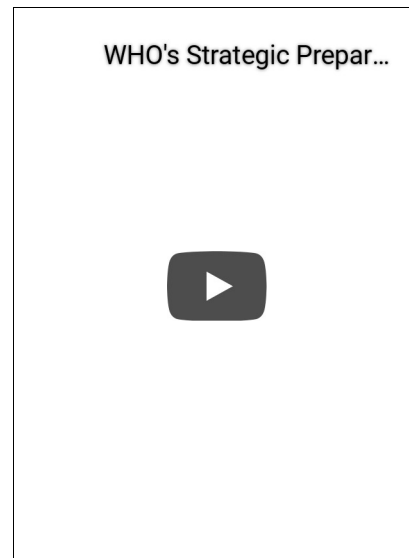

### Coordinating COVID-19 vaccine deployment through the WHO COVID-19 Partners Platform

Severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2), the virus that causes the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19), is having a deep impact across the globe. As of 4 February 2021, over 103 million confirmed cases and 2.25 million deaths due to COVID-19 had been reported.<sup>1</sup> The pandemic has also affected economic productivity and contributed to the deepest global recession since the Second World War.<sup>2</sup> The human and financial toll of the pandemic has highlighted the need for a model to support coordinated international emergency response.<sup>3</sup>

Implementing partners and donors in their COVID-19 response. At the core of the platform is a centralized digital environment where countries and partners, in the context of an outbreak, can: (i) develop and share plans; (ii) monitor and review implemented actions; (iii) cost plan, share resource needs, and request critical supplies; and (iv) view and track donor contributions. These four basic functionalities are fundamental to emergency response in every nation, regardless of whether resources come from the international community or are domestically available. As of 4 February 2021, the platform

coming months through the global COVAX Facility. As a part of the Access to COVID-19 Tools (ACT) Accelerator, the facility aims to accelerate the development and manufacture of COVID-19 vaccines and promote equitable global access to these vaccines.<sup>4</sup> Setting up vaccination programmes usually takes years. For COVID-19 vaccine deployment, governments have less time to prepare. Preparation includes identifying prioritized groups for vaccination, given the limited vaccine doses; developing service delivery strategies; supporting training and supervision of health-care workers; addressing
