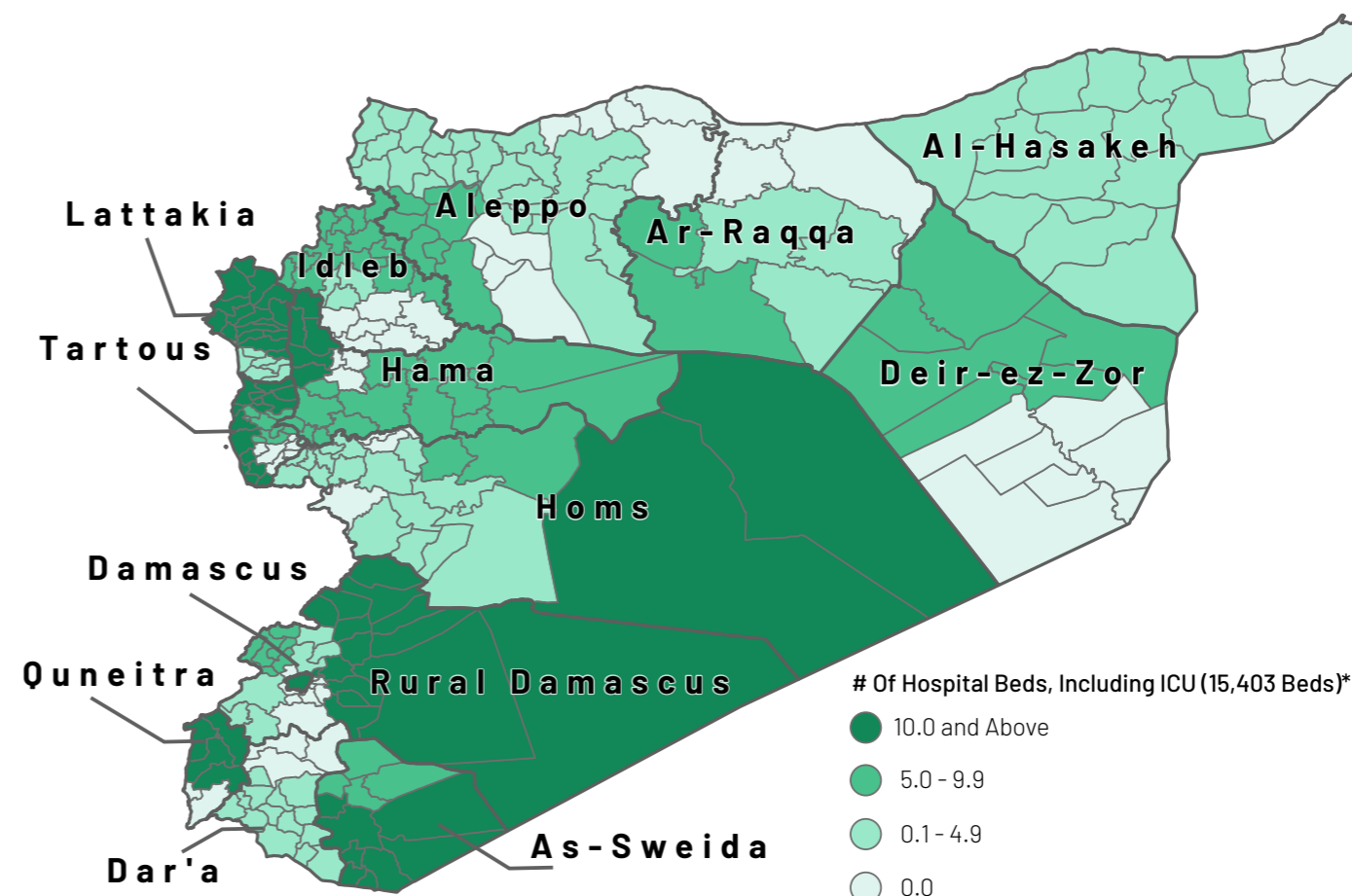

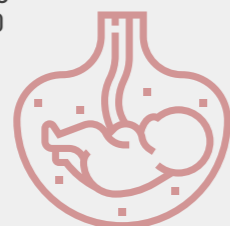
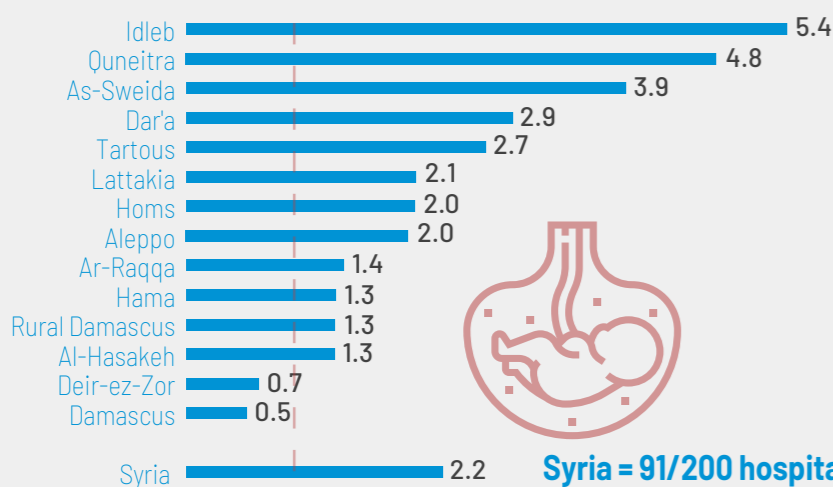
Hospital Beds (Including ICU)

Although current SPHERE³ Standards call for 18 hospital beds per 10,000 population, given the very low number of beds in Syria, the health sector continues to use the 2010 IASC² standard of 10 hospital beds per 10,000 population in order to illustrate meaningful differences in service availability across Syria.

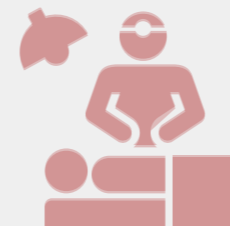
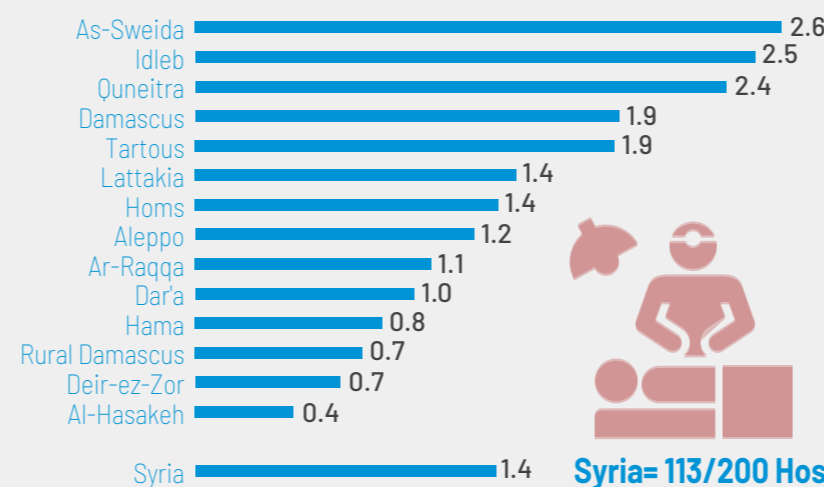
Number of Hospitals providing CEmONC⁴ Services/ 500,000 Population

8% increase in hospitals providing CEmONC⁴ Services between Q1 2020 and Q1 2021

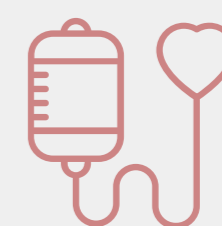
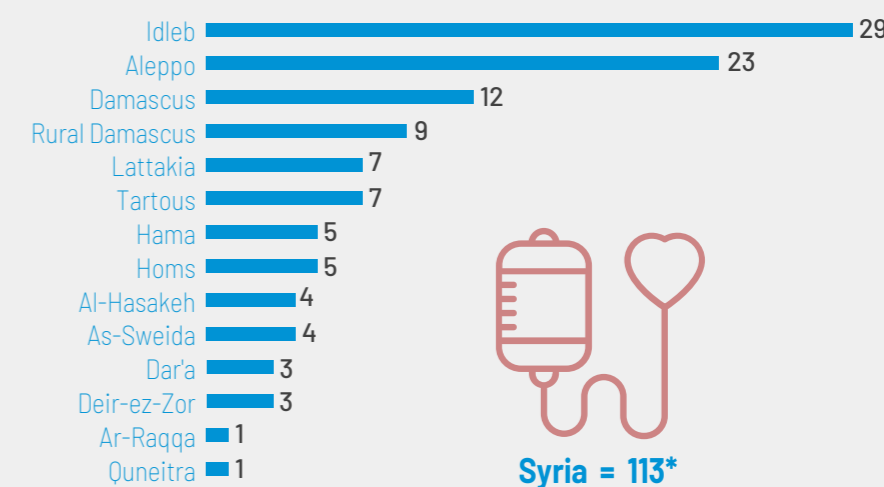
Number of Hospitals Providing Surgeries/Trauma services / 250,000 Population

18% increase in health facilities providing Blood Bank Services between Q1 2020 and Q1 2021

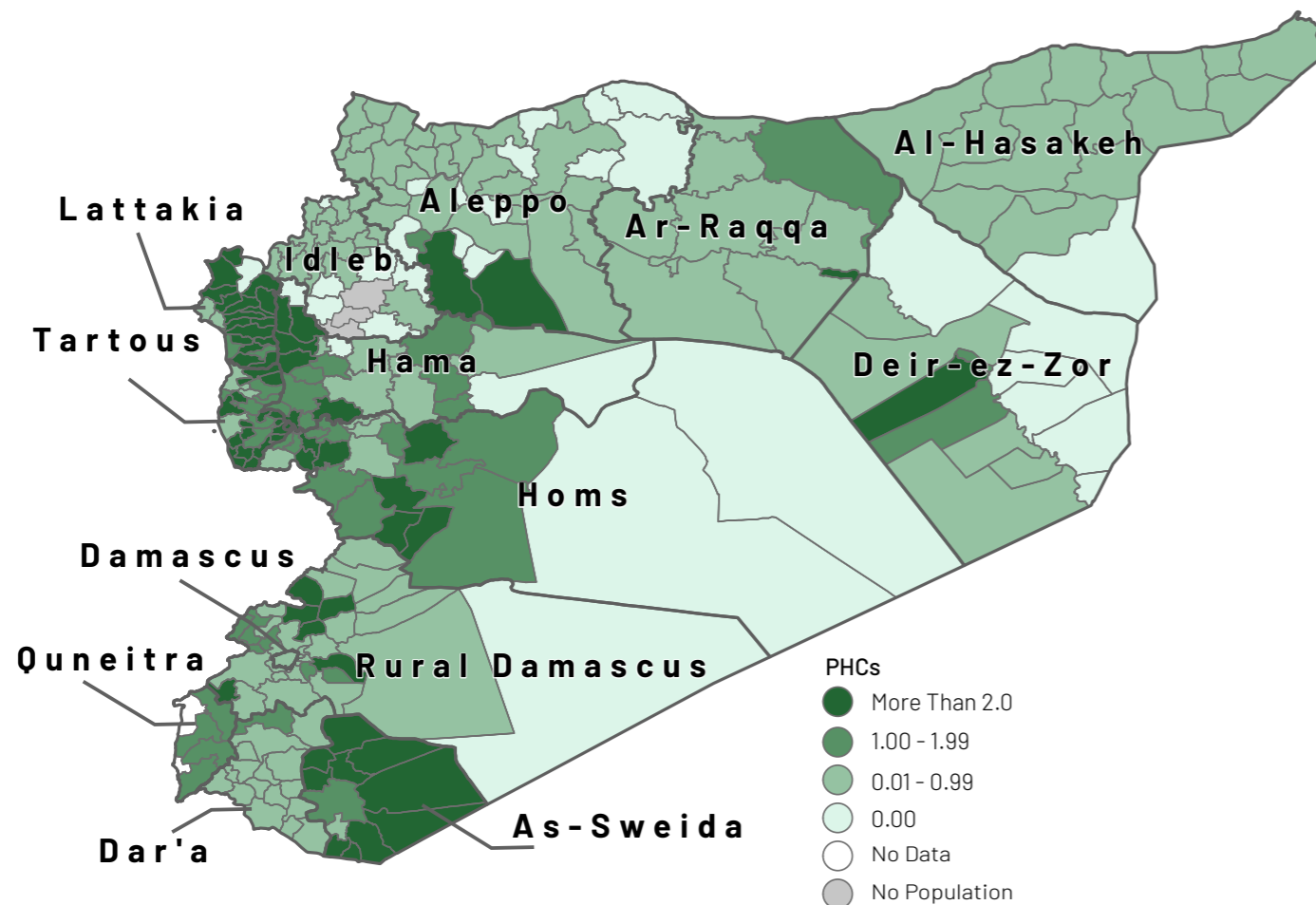

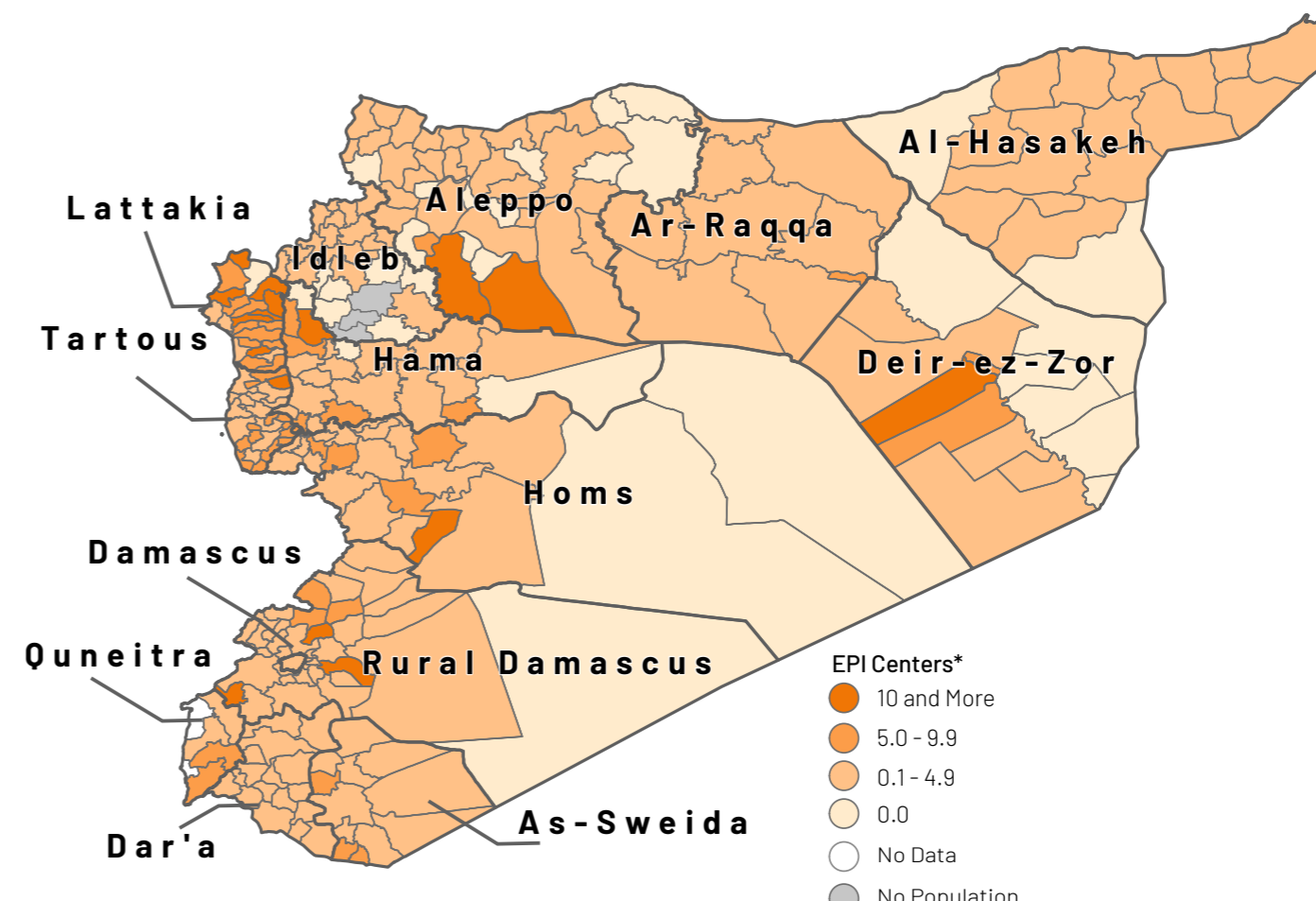

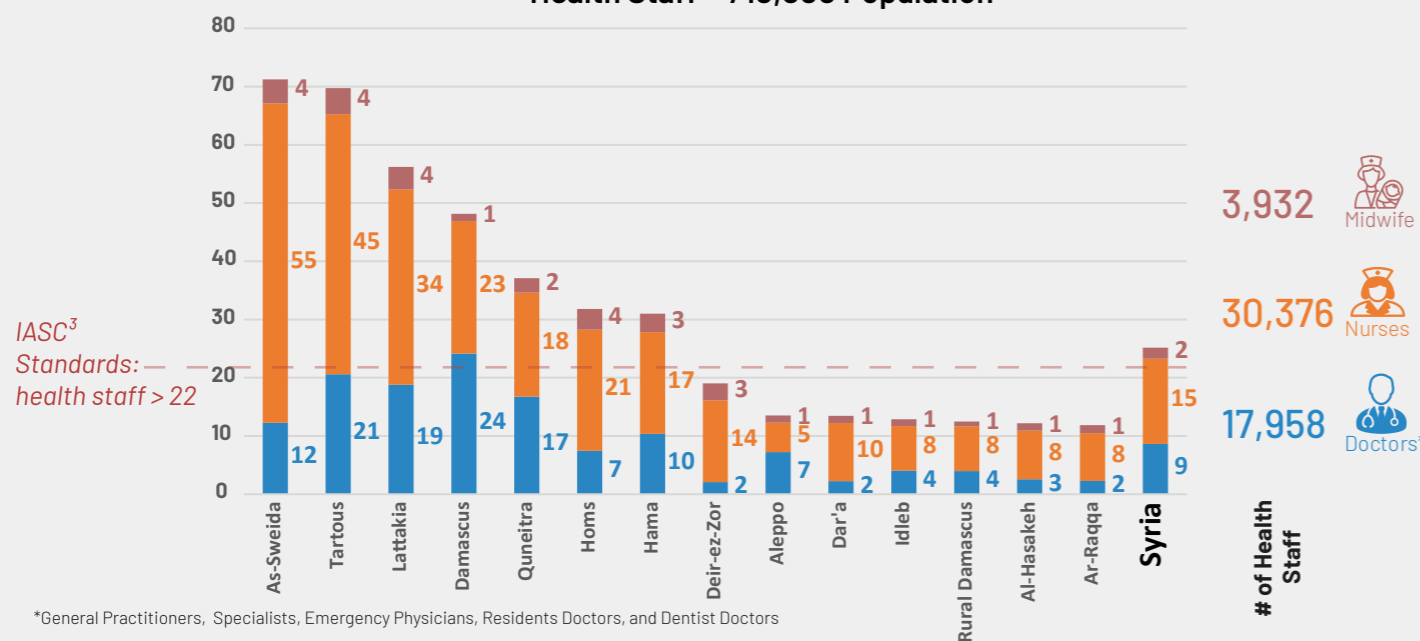

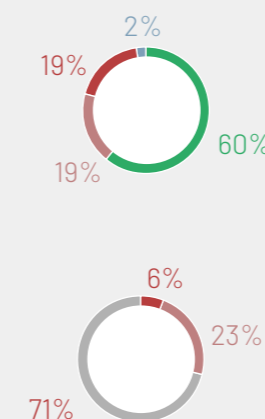

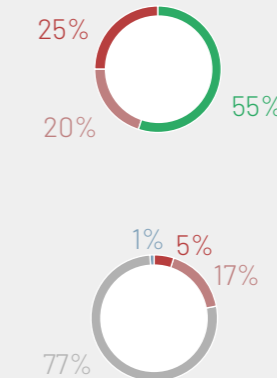

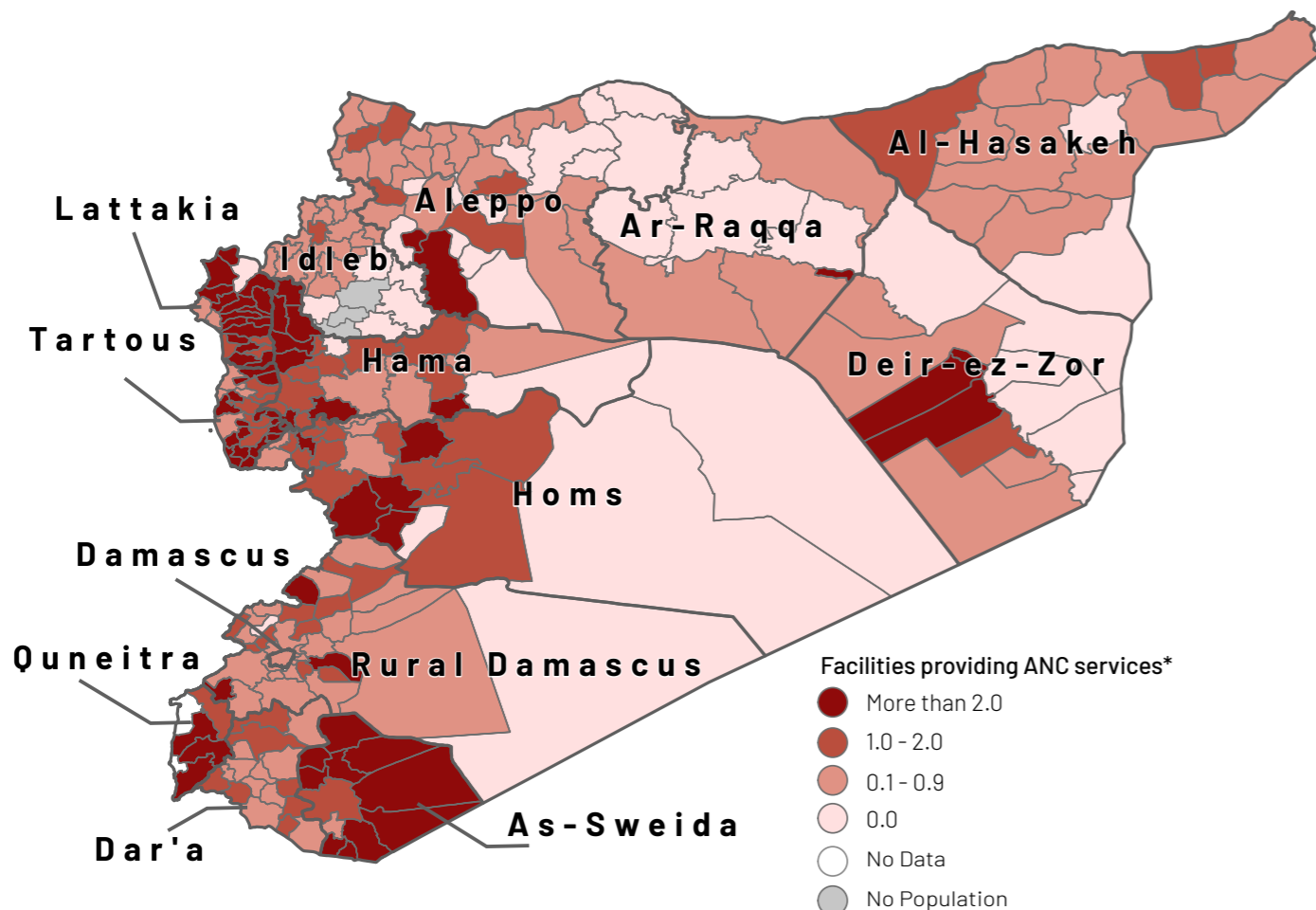

Antenatal Care (ANC) Services

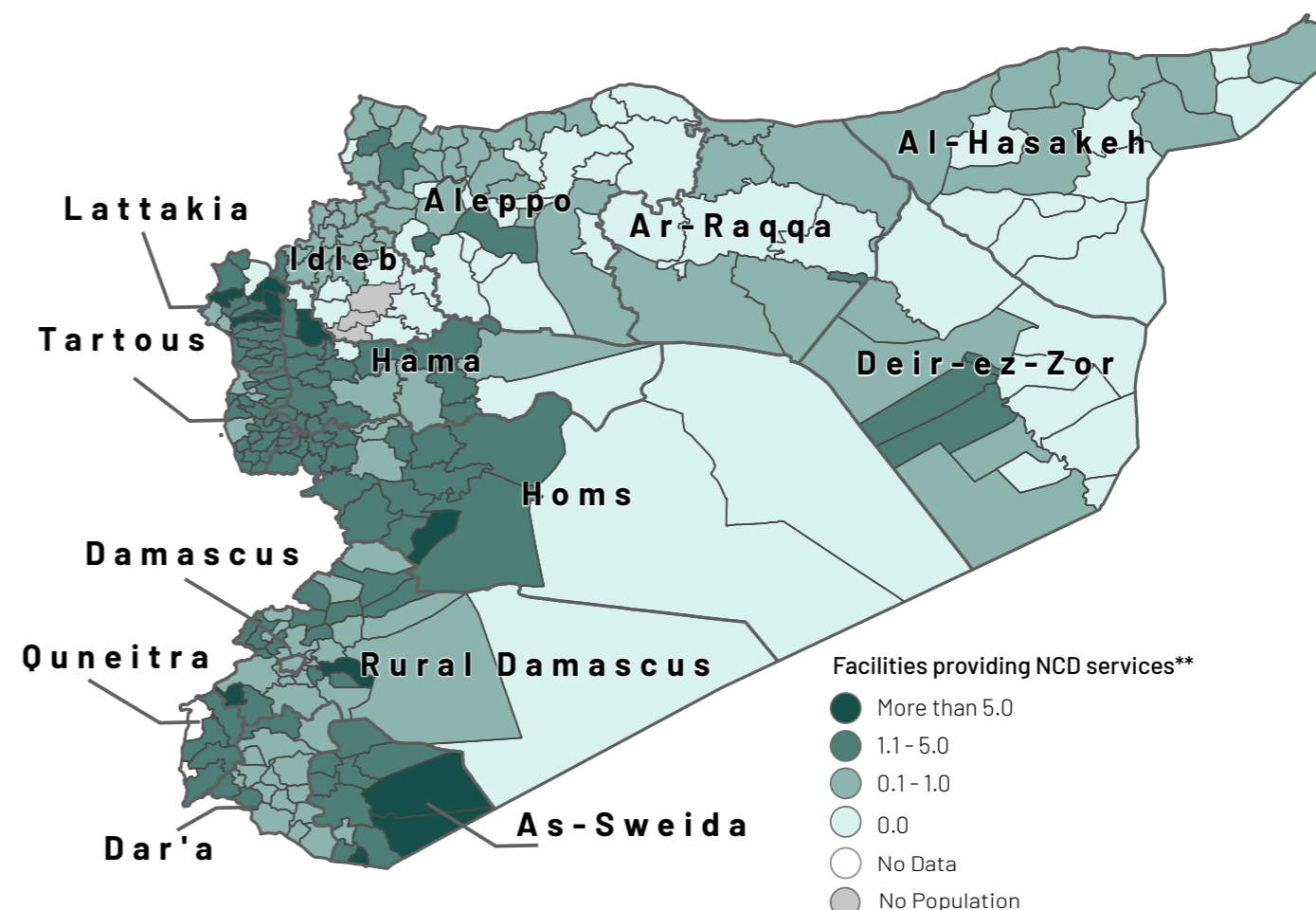

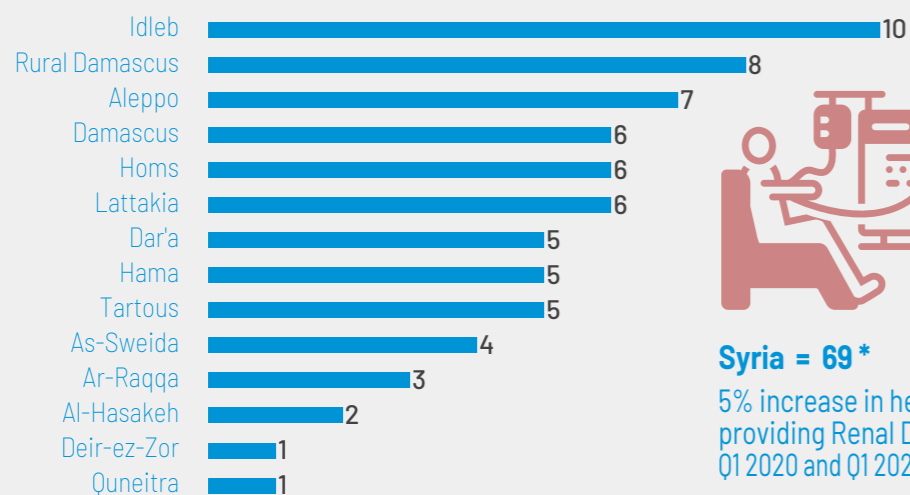
Non-Communicable Diseases (NCD) Services

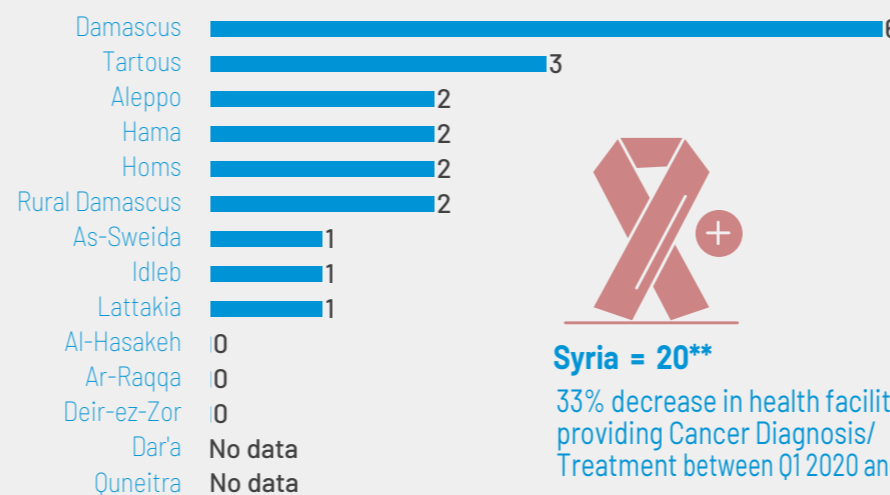
Number of Health Facilities providing Renal Dialysis

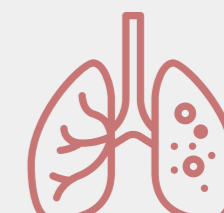
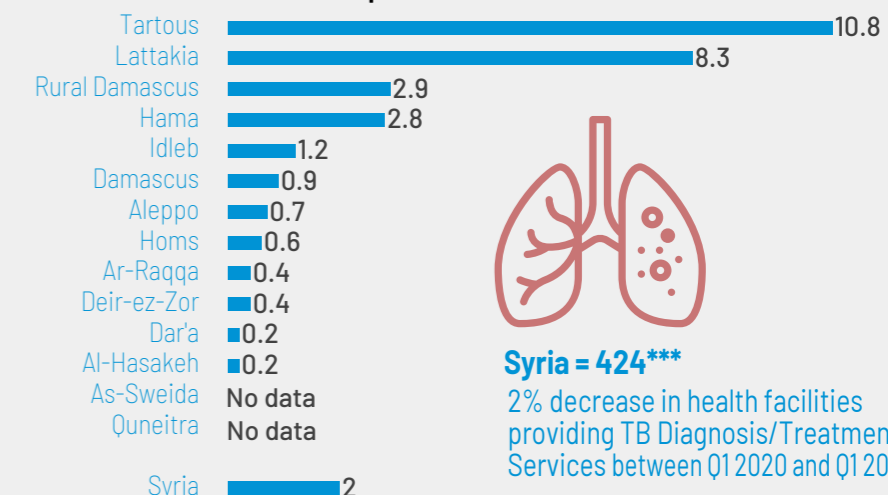
Number of Health Facilities providing Cancer Diagnosis/Treatment

Number of Health Facilities Providing Tuberculosis (TB) Diagnosis/Treatment Services/100,000 Population

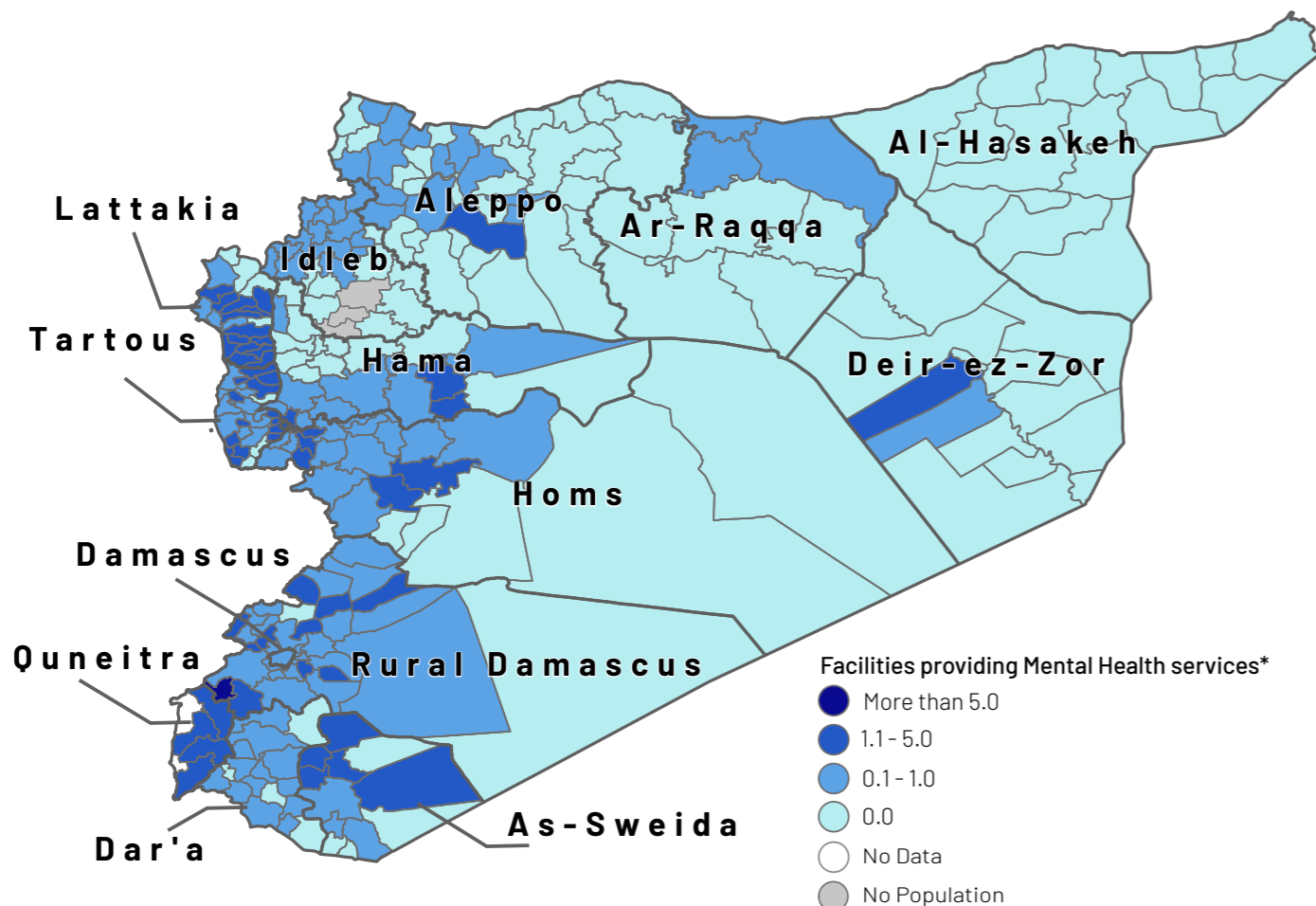

Mental Health Services

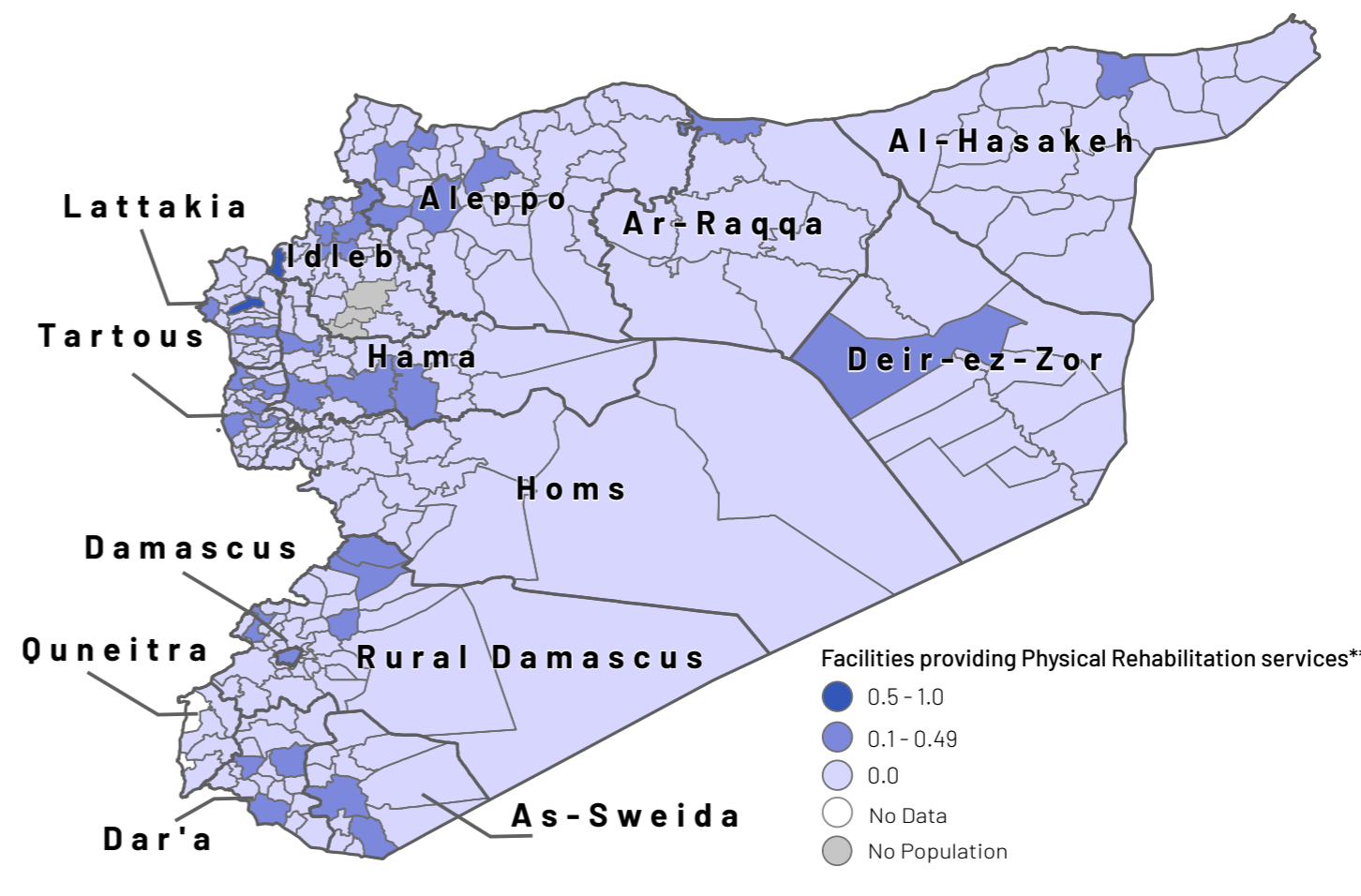
